Grow in your faith this Advent: During the busy-ness of Christmas preparations, it's easy to lose sight of what the season is all about. We can keep our focus and grow in our faith, however, if we take some time together to look at the themes of Advent. This year we are running a short, four week Advent group, to give us exactly this opportunity. We will meet on Wednesday mornings, from 10.30 - noon, in the 'Warm and Welcome' room (the Cottage Room) of the Parish Centre. Each week we'll start with tea/coffee and biscuits before discussing one of the traditional themes of the season: Hope, Joy, Peace, and Love. Please do join us whenever you can—we start on 29th November, and will be led by Revd Janet.

St Guthlac's Church: Advent & Christmas Services and Events

Advent midweek Communion: Each Thursday, at 9.30am Our midweek Communion service will have an Advent theme, and help to keep us focussed on our personal and spiritual preparation for Christmas celebrations.

The third of four special times to pause and be with God. – come any Wednesday you can. We meet in the Welcome Room at St Mary's Parish Centre on the corner of Brinsmead Road and Church Lane. Traditional Carols and Readings: Wednesday 20th Dec. 7.30 pm A traditional service celebrating the birth of Jesus with Bible readings and poems, alongside Christmas carols and choral music, led by the St Guthlac's Church Choir.

Crib Service: Sunday 24th December 4.00 pm

Join us for an informal service, particularly suited for children, where youngsters are encouraged to help tell the Christmas story by placing the nativity figures in the stable.

We join together to celebrate Christmas Day with a service of Holy Communion for All.
