Lent and Holy Week at St Mary's and St Guthlac's

As Easter is early this year, so we start Lent much earlier than we are used to. As we move through the weeks leading up to the great celebration of the Resurrection there are a number of opportunities in the benefice to reflect on our faith and prepare:

Lent Study Group – every Wednesday morning, from 10.30am to 12 noon, in the 'Warm & Welcome Room' (the Cottage Room) at the Parish Centre, on the corner of Brinsmead Road and Church Lane. Rev'd Cecilia will be leading us in looking at 'A Letter for Lent' – group discussions with a focus on St Paul's Letter to the Colossians. Meetings begin on Wednesday 21st February up to and including 27th March. Everyone welcome, even if you can't make every week. There'll also be tea, coffee and refreshments each week.

Palm Sunday this year is **24th March** – at St Mary's there will be a Sung Eucharist and at St Guthlac's Morning Prayer.

Wednesday of Holy Week, 27th March, will be marked with a service of Choral Evensong at St Guthlac's. at 7.30pm.

On **Maundy Thursday**, **28**th **March**, we will remember the Last Supper of Jesus, and the events that followed that evening before his execution, in a special service at St Guthlac's. We will share Communion within a service of prayers, readings and music. Everyone welcome from both churches (or neither!).

Good Friday is 29th March, and begins with a service for All Ages at St Guthlac's, at 10.30am. In the afternoon, beginning at 2pm, there will be a service of Meditations at the Cross, at St Mary's, including hymns, readings, quietness and reflections on the crucifixion, leading up to the hour of Jesus's death at 3pm.

Easter Sunday, 31st March is celebrated at both churches with a Sung Eucharist at 10.30am.

Run The Wall 2024

Together with thousands of other participants worldwide, I'll be taking part in "Run The Wall" on the first weekend of March as an act of solidarity with the

Palestinian people, as a call for Palestinian rights, and to demand an end to the war on Gaza. Across the world, participants will run, walk or ride for a distance up to 55 km over the same weekend – for me this means a very modest run of 5km!

Human rights organisation Amos Trust started *Run The Wall* in 2021 with their Palestinian friends at *Right To Movement*, and its name refers to the Israeli Separation Wall that divides Palestinian people and hugely disrupts their daily lives. Each year now, Amos Trust invites people from around the world to run for Palestine on the same weekend as 10,000 people participate in the Palestine Marathon in Bethlehem.

This year 'Run the Wall' is hoping to raise £60,000 for Amos Trust's work in Palestine- £30,000 to rebuild a Palestinian home in the West Bank that was destroyed by the Israeli Authorities, and £30,000 for emergency relief in Gaza.

Minster Communities – the next step.

Over the past eighteen months or so, a new framework for the mission and ministry of the Church of England in our diocese has been emerging, centred on the formation of new "Minster Communities".

Each Minster Community is a group of local churches who commit to working together much more closely, to sharing clergy, staff and resources and to growing in understanding, appreciation and support of each other. Minster Communities offer the opportunity to maintain parish worship in the face of reducing budgets and congregations, but at the same time look outwards, particularly to young people, with new forms of outreach, service and discipleship.

The process towards forming Minster Communities in the City of Leicester and it's suburbs is now beginning. Both St Mary's and St Guthlac's have been invited to join the series of meetings and discussions, perhaps taking up to 18 months, with other local churches (over 40!) with a view to the formation of 6-8 Minster Communities.

Each Church is asked to send two lay representatives, nominated by the PCC, to the meetings - but critically, all decisions remain in the hands of the PCC itself, and it is hoped that the whole congregation will keep informed and take part in parish conversations about the process. No church will be forced to join a Minster Community if they don't feel this is the right way ahead for them.

So, what happens now?

The PCC will be holding a **special meeting** on **Tuesday 19th March at 7.30pm** in the Welcome Area of the Church, to formally agree (or not) to our taking part in these discernment conversations and first discussions, and to propose representatives. As this is such an important step in our life together, *everyone* who feels themselves to be part of the life of St Guthlac's is welcome to come to the PCC, to hear all about it and to ask your questions.

The first Information Event provided by the Diocesan Parish Transition Team, who are supporting churches in the process, is on 23rd April. We will then report back to the whole church on the pattern of meetings to come, and we will begin seeking everyone's views on each step of the process – there will be plenty of opportunity for you to voice your opinions!

We will also make plenty of opportunities to pray about the future as well – this is a hugely significant step for every church in our diocese and we need to be certain that God is guiding us as we head into the future. Please do encourage the PCC and support all of us in your prayers.
