Mothers' Union Fellowship Our next meeting is on **Tuesday, 28**th **May** when our local PCSO Lynette Steadman will talk about her work with the Neighbourhood Police. We meet, as usual, at 1.30 for a 2pm start in the Lounge of the Parish Centre.

Malawi- an extract from a letter from Bishop Christopher to Fiona Wingate.

The life of the clinic continues. Recently, Dr John Chipolombwe sent me his most recent budget MK22, 711.740 which I will attach.

They have 16 trips planned for the rest of this year plus the purchase of a number of diagnostic machines to enhance their work.

Trips will also include likuni phala, the protein and iron enriched flour for porridge, to help fight malnutrition in infants and pregnant women.

I will be sending the clinic a little over £10,000 which I have told them will empty the fund completely.

Aware of this they asked if I would still send them the funds. I've agreed.

I also pointed out several times to DNM that our donor base is small and elderly. Moreover, our continuance in these last few years has been sustained by two modest legacies and a number of significant donations, which I have shephered well.

Depending on what we receive from now and over the next 12 months will determine whether we have funds for any trips next year.

I attended a coffee morning just over a week ago which raised £205 from St Andrew's Prestworld and soon £300 will come from Coleshill Church in the Diocese of Birmingham.

Malawi has suffered two massive devaluations of the Malawi Kwacha in November 2022 and May 2023. This has impacted significantly on our running costs.

Each trip cost £545. This covers the following:

 £268 - Drugs and medical supplies - given without charge to the patients

- •£124 Allowances for 2 clinicians, 3 nurses and 1 driver
- •£ 33 Likuni Phala for the undernourished pregnant women and under 5s
- •£120 Fuel for the trip

Even so it still only costs around £2.73 per patient depending on the numbers attending an individual clinic.

Many thanks again for all you and St Guthlac's are doing.

ARE YOU ABLE TO HELP?

To give an idea of the costs of the clinic, their budget for 2024 (referred to above), includes about £1500 for new equipment and 16 visits at about £545 per visit; assuming their currency doesn't devalue further. Making their total budget for the year about £10500.

Over the years we have always supported this cause very generously. I currently have just over £500 in our fund to send to Malawi, but it would be good to get that a bit higher so we can boost their funds. Here are several ways you can donate. Tea and Talk meeting for June...

My 25 Years at the BBC Dave Andrews

Tuesday 11th June at 7pm St Guthlac's Church, Holbrook Rd LE2 3LF

Dave will talk about his 21 years at BBC Radio Leicester. He presented almost every programme on the Station and reported and commentated on many notable events including the Richard III story and the late Queen's visits.



Dave is a local resident of Knighton. He began his teaching career in Leicestershire before joining the BBC in 2000. He chaired the long running and record-breaking gardening programme 'Down to Earth' for many years and spearheaded the Station's 40th birthday Ruby Rainbow Appeal which raised over £600 000 for Rainbows Children's Hospice. He was made a Deputy Lord-Lieutenant of Leicestershire in 2015.
