## The Collect and Readings for the Third Sunday after Trinity

Almighty God, you have broken the tyranny of sin and have sent the Spirit of your Son into our hearts whereby we call you Father: give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service, that we and all creation may be brought to the glorious liberty of the children of God; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

## Cecilia's Ordination .... once again!

Many of you will know that in the Church of England ordination takes place in two stages. Last summer our curate Cecilia was ordained as a Deacon by Bishop Saju, in a splendid and moving service at All Saints, Loughborough. This year, on **Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> June at 4pm in Leicester Cathedral**, she will be ordained as a Priest by Bishop Martyn – this means she will be able to lead and preside at the full range of our services, including the Eucharist (or Holy Communion). Everyone is welcome to join this special service and I hope you'll share Cecilia's special day if you can – the Cathedral doors open at 3.15pm.

The following day, **Sunday 30**<sup>th</sup> **June**, Cecilia will preside at the Eucharist for the first time during our special joint benefice service at St Mary's, when the preacher will be the Revd Mrytle Cook, who has been Cecilia's mentor and supporter during her vocational journey. Again, I do hope that you'll be able to come and support Cecilia and her family as she passes this milestone in her curacy with us.

# Malawi- an extract from a letter from Bishop Christopher to Fiona Wingate.

The life of the clinic continues. They have 16 trips planned for the rest of this year plus the purchase of a number of diagnostic machines to enhance their work. Trips will also include likuni phala, the protein and iron enriched flour for porridge, to help fight malnutrition in infants and pregnant women.

I will be sending the clinic a little over £10,000 which I have told them will empty the fund completely.

Depending on what we receive from now and over the next 12 months will determine whether we have funds for any trips next year.

Malawi has suffered two massive devaluations of the Malawi Kwacha in November 2022 and May 2023. This has impacted significantly on our running costs. Each trip costs £545, equating to around £2.73 per patient depending on the numbers attending an individual clinic.

Many thanks again for all you and St Guthlac's are doing.

#### **ARE YOU ABLE TO HELP?**

To give an idea of the costs of the clinic, their budget for 2024 (referred to above), includes about £1500 for new equipment and 16 visits at about £545 per visit; assuming their currency doesn't devalue further. Making their total budget for the year about £10500.

Over the years we have always supported this cause very generously. I currently have just over £500 in our fund to send to Malawi, but it would be good to get that a bit higher so we can boost their funds. Here are several ways you can donate. ## General Election 2024: "Pray your part!"

Each day explores a different theme, with a short Bible reading, reflection and prayer for a different aspect of our common life.
