Annual General Meeting and Leicester City Flora Talk

Our Annual General Meeting will be on **Tuesday 17th September 2024 at 7.30pm** in the Lounge at Knighton Parish Centre on Church Lane, Knighton. The speaker will be **Russell Parry**, a local Leicester botanist, who will be talking about his survey work looking at plants in the Leicester area, with the title:**Leicester City Flora - Reasons for hope?**

Russell writes: Back in the mid 20th century it was thought that if a variety of wildflowers was sought, one should take a trip out of town and into the countryside. In recent years there has been an increasing awareness that this can be a very frustrating experience unless travelling to a very specific conserved area. A few years ago I started to notice just how much botanic variety there was when walking the Leicester streets, and decided to record this in more detail. During the winter months I investigated all previous botanic records for the City area. This talk is a summary of the findings up to the end of 2023, and a description of an attempt to find 'the bigger picture'.
