

Minster Community update: At the end of September our parish representatives joined others from Anglican churches across the city, at a special day to learn more about the proposed Minster Communities - groupings of churches working together and sharing people and resources. Over the summer, our PCC had worked hard, prayed deeply and talked long about which other local churches might form a good partnership with us and where God might be calling us to explore closer relationships. The proposals made by the Diocesan Transition Team didn't line up particularly well with our own discernment, however, and so we still have much to do in the next two months! We will give you a further update soon. In the meantime, please do take one of the special Minster Community Prayer Cards from the back of the church, and use the prayer regularly, asking God to help us as we shape the future form of our local churches. Minster Group Discernment: Visiting Local Churches

Sunday 27th October

The Diocese has suggested that St Guthlac's and St Mary's should be part of a Minster Community covering Evington, Humberstone and Scraptoft. There are 9 churches plus St Guthlac's and St Mary's involved.

St Guthlac's PCC agreed to visit all the churches in this proposed Minster Group. Then they will have a better idea of how to comment on its merits or otherwise to the Diocese.

We are planning to do this on <u>Sunday 27th October</u>. Each member of the PCC will visit one church and attend their morning service. Ideally, we would like another member of the congregation to accompany each PCC member. If you would like take part in the visits, please contact Tina or any member of the PCC.

Adrian will be leading a service of Morning Prayer at St Guthlac's on 27th October for those who are not taking part in the visits. It will be an opportunity to pray for the whole Minster Discernment process.
