Christmas Hamper Raffle

As in previous years there will be a Christmas Hamper raffle in aid of the health clinic project in Malawi which we support. The raffle will be drawn at the Christmas Fayre on Dec 7th. A list of suggested donations for the hamper is in the welcome area and will be very gratefully received. The last date for bringing items for the hamper will be Sunday 1st Dec. Thank you.

EcoTip for November: Green your home. Combat climate change and reduce heating costs by identifying and sealing drafts around your home. Find the gaps that let the cold air in and warm air out (think keyholes, letterboxes, cracks around the edges or bottoms of windows and doors, loft hatches, floorboards, etc.) and fix these gaps using the correct materials and online tutorials. Additionally, place foil or radiator panels to reflect heat into your room. Pray for those who might be experiencing the cold this winter.

Minster Community update: At the end of September our parish representatives joined others from Anglican churches across the city, at a special day to learn more about the proposed Minster Communities - groupings of churches working together and sharing people and resources. Over the summer, our PCC had worked hard, prayed deeply and talked long about which other local churches might form a good partnership with us and where God might be calling us to explore closer relationships. The proposals made by the Diocesan Transition Team didn't line up particularly well with our own discernment, however, and so we still have much to do in the next two months! We will give you a further update soon. In the meantime, please do take one of the special Minster Community Prayer Cards from the back of the church, and use the prayer regularly, asking God to help us as we shape the future form of our local churches. Advent Read & Discussion Group

Read a good book- and grow in faith this Advent: As well as a time of preparation, Advent can be a time for our faith to grow. As a help this year we are suggesting you might like to read the book "Women of the Nativity" by renowned Christian writer Paula Gooder. The book consists of nine stories, 'reimagined' from the experiences of women who appear in the Bible account of the birth of Jesus (although not all by name). After Christmas we will organise a 'book club's discussion of the stories and our responses to them.

If you'd like a copy of the book yourself, please let Adrian know as soon as possible. Each costs £11 but payment can be later.

In the meantime, you might like to join an Advent discussion group, at St Mary's Parish Centre, on Wednesday mornings, from 10.30- noon, starting with tea/coffee. The first meeting will be on Wednesday 27th November, and each time we'll focus on one or two of the women, and how they might encourage our faith to grow. Everyone welcome!
