## The Collect and Readings for the Third Sunday of Advent

O Lord Jesus Christ,
who at your first coming sent your messenger
to prepare your way before you:
grant that the ministers and stewards of your mysteries
may likewise so prepare and make ready your way
by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just,
that at your second coming to judge the world
we may be found an acceptable people in your sight;
for you are alive and reign with the Father
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Psalm: Isaiah 12.2-6

**2nd Reading:** Philippians 4.4-7 **Gospel Reading:** Luke 3.7-18

Please Note: On Sunday 29th December there will be **no service** at St Guthlac's or St. Mary's.


## **Benefice Magazine**
