

The Collect and Readings for the Second Sunday before Lent

Almighty God, you have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image: teach us to discern your hand in all your works and your likeness in all your children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit reigns supreme over all things, now and for ever.


Getting the most out of Lent 2025

Lent is the traditional part of the Christian year that covers the weeks before Easter, and acts as a preparation for the sombre reflection of Good Friday and the joyful celebration of Easter Day. There are many ways in which you can make it a special time to nurture and grow your Christian faith, and I would encourage you to make the most of the season. Here are some ideas:

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday**, which is the 5th March this year. Every year we have a special benefice Communion service at 7.30pm – in 2025 the service is at St Guthlac's. Christians have often prepared for this rather serious service by skipping a meal or reducing what they eat on Ash Wednesday – meaning that we become much more aware of our physical needs and wants, at the same time as considering our spiritual weaknesses, in the light of God's deep understanding and forgiveness. Our service includes the opportunity for "ashing" – when, if you wish, the priest marks each forehead with a small cross of ash made from last year's Palm crosses, as a sign of our turning back to God in repentance.

In Lent 2025 there will also be weekly opportunities for you to join other members of our churches in a **Lent discussion group** that will encourage and build your faith.

You can join the **Wednesday morning group**, at 10.30am in the small Cottage Room in the St Mary's Parish Centre, beginning on 5th March. We will be looking at "Falling back on God" – a Lent study for groups, following the theme of 'trust' in the Psalms, and written by Joel Edwards. There's no need to buy the book, which is about £8, but if you would like to then please let Adrian know.



OR you might prefer the **Thursday afternoon group**, which will meet at the home of Janet Edwards at 2.30pm, beginning on 13th March. The group will be led by Tina Jarvis and discussion will centre on sections of the book "Wild Bright Hope: reflections on faith." Please see the separate item for more details.

OR you might like to join the **Thursday evening group**, that will meet in the Narthex of St Mary's at 7.30pm, starting on 13th March, led by Revd Janet Gasper.

Christians have traditionally used lent as a **time of discipline** and **training** – either by giving up something pleasurable so that more time can be given to prayer or Bible reading, or more money can be given away, *or* by taking on a task for the benefit of others. Perhaps this year you might consider reading a chapter a day (making 40 in all) of the Gospels of Mark and then Luke? Then you might also consider putting aside one tin or packet of food each day from Ash Wednesday onwards (not including Sundays) as a donation to our local foodbank? Let's pray that Lent will be a time that God speaks to us all, and that, as he helps us understand our weaknesses afresh, we might also find more loving understanding of each other. *Adrian*

Minster Communities: Many of you will know that the parishes of the diocese are currently going through a process of reorganisation into new 'Minster Communities'. These Minster Communities will give us all the benefits of closer partnership in a challenging financial climate. Over the past year the PCC have been involved in numerous discussions about those areas of experience and expertise that St Guthlac's can offer to other churches, and what we might look to gain from others too.

We have now reached a significant stage in the process, when representatives from all the churches in our proposed Minster Community are beginning to meet in a number of working groups, each tasked with exploring a different aspect of how, practically, we might best work together in partnership (schools & young people, buildings, finance etc).

To help everyone understand as clearly as possible what is happening we have produced a summary leaflet about the proposals, and there is a new display at the back of the church which includes a map of our proposed Minster Community. You can also join me for an informal "Any Questions?" evening when I'll attempt to explain what's happening and clear up mysteries and misunderstandings! "Any Questions?" will be on **Wednesday 26th February** in the lounge of the parish centre and you'll also be able to join via Zoom, if you follow this link:


Free Film Night
