The Collect and Readings for Mothering Sunday

God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Mothering Sunday 2025

Mothering Sunday has come a long way from its origins, when people used to return to the 'mother church' where they were baptised, but it remains an important time to foster closeness and relationships - we share flowers and gifts with loved ones and remember all those who have shown us mothering care. So, once again, in Church, on 30th March, we will have a special service, reflect on God's love shown to us, and express our thanks and appreciation for mothers. This year our joint benefice service is at St Mary's.

All of this is good but there is another perspective too. Today we are very much more aware of the great variety of mother-child relationships in our society, and that our experiences are not always positive. Remembering Mum's who have died, whether recently or some years ago, is also sad and poignant on this day. Mothering Sunday can be a painful day for many people.

We also know that it is not only birth mothers, and indeed not only women, who can demonstrate the loving care that we think of as "mothering", towards others. Mothering Sunday, therefore, is becoming much more than a traditional celebration – rather, it is a day to remember and celebrate the loving relationships between



generations, alongside reflection on the pain and distance that can also be a feature of these relationships - and a day to seek God's healing for our fractured society.

Having said all of that, there will still be much in

our service that we will all recognise, and a real sense of gratitude to all mothers and carers. Sunday Club for the children will run as usual, but they'll also enjoy their time with the adults in church. Do please stay for refreshments after the service!
