# Meeting of Parishioners for the election of churchwardens and Annual Parochial Church Meeting: Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> May at 12 noon in St Guthlac's Church

We will be electing:

- 2 churchwardens
- 2 representatives for Deanery Synod (casual vacancies as we currently have no reps)
- 3 PCC members for 3 years and 1 member for 2 years

**Gardening Party.** Thank you to everyone who was able to join the gardening party on Monday 5th, given the short notice. A good deal, and wide scope, of work was done by the group which included our wider community.

The hedge was given a gentle tidy to ensure that footpaths and walkways are clear allowing our neighbours easy access. A good deal of weeding was done to remove/reduce some of the invasive species like mare's tail and three cornered leek. Three cornered leek is often mistakenly planted as wild garlic. We have a lot in the garden so next year we would like to harvest it for people who might like to take and use it in recipes. Keep an eye (and nose) out for this The roses have been tendered and fed with manure to ensure they're looking their best in memory of our friends Lee and June Parry. Some of the laurel has been thinned to keep it away from the choir vestry building to ensure the fabric of the building is protected. The area between the church and the hall has been scarified to try break up the thick matting and to try encourage biodiversity. It doesn't look very pretty right now but like so many things we' re hoping that this period of not looking too good will bring about great flourishing so please do bear with us.

Thank you also for the very welcomed refreshments provided. Again, thank you to everyone for supporting the work to care for the natural world and making the garden a space for the whole community.

Meet Aurelia: An inspirational farmer and community leader. Aurelia and her family belong to the Indigenous Q'egchi' community of the Alta Verapaz region in Guatemala.

The climate crisis and industrial plantations have changed Q'eqchi' land dramatically. Heatwaves, storms and unpredictable seasons are ravaging farms. Industrial agriculture is taking over the last of the region's natural resources to feed the world's richest countries.

Many of the vital crops that Aurelia depends on are withering and dving before her eyes.

With funding from Christian Aid, Congcoop supports communities to return to Indigenous farming practices and adopt agroecological approaches that conserve their land, culture and livelihood. Agroecology, put simply, is farming in a sustainable way that works with, not against, nature. It's the application of ecological principles in farming – a blend of ancient and modern wisdom.

By working with Congcoop, Aurelia's gained the skills and knowledge to cultivate native seeds that are better suited to the changing climate. She's producing her own organic fertiliser, creating nurseries, constructing rainwater collection systems, and making nutritious food and medicine for her chickens.

Thanks to Aurelia's ever-growing knowledge base, she's now cultivating cacao, sugarcane, cinnamon, corn and pineapples. It's steady progress that holds promise. Aurelia's resolute hope has also inspired her to develop and lead other activities in her community, including producing chocolate, establishing a farmers' market, and fighting for women's rights.
