The Collect and Readings for Pentecost

God, who as at this time taught the hearts of your faithful people by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit: grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgement in all things and evermore to rejoice in his holy comfort; through the merits of Christ Jesus our Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Uzbekistan's Silk Road Cities Simon Bennett

Simon visited Uzbekistan in April 2024 and stayed in the Silk Road cities of Tashkent, Khiva, Bukhara and Samarkand.
