

The Collect and Readings for the First Sunday after Trinity

O God,

the strength of all those who put their trust in you, mercifully accept our prayers and, because through the weakness of our mortal nature we can do no good thing without you, grant us the help of your grace, that in the keeping of your commandments we may please you both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

1st Reading: 1 Kings 19.1-4(5-7)8-15a;

Psalms 42, 43;

2nd Reading: Galatians 3.23-29; **Gospel Reading:** Luke 8.26-39

Praying for each other: Please pray for other members of our church community, and especially those whose surnames begin with U, V, W, X, Y and W. Pray for their encouragement, joyful peace and resilience in the face of challenges.

Praying for the World: With so much violence, revenge and hatred on the world stage, it is tempting to lose hope. Pray that Christians across the world will hear God's call to be peacemakers, and will be renewed in our faith and trust that all things are within God's control,

and his good purpose will prevail. Pray for the relief of suffering everywhere and an end to conflict through the courage of men and women seeking the common good.

Praying for the Church: Please pray for our Link Diocese of Trichy, serving a large section of the state of Tamil Nadu, situated in South-East India. Pray for the Revd Suresh Kumar (whom many of us remember from his time serving as a priest at St Phillip's, Evington) who is acting in a 'caretaker' capacity as Bishop until a new appointment can be made. Pray for the administrative and financial challenges faced by the diocese, and for some recent inter-faith tensions. In our own diocese, please pray for the people and leaders of the churches in Glen Magna cum Stretton Magna, Carton Curlieu & Burton Overy, also in Kibworth with Smeeton Westerby & Saddington.

Praying for those in need: Please pray for all those who are in need at the moment, those who are unwell in body, mind or spirit, those who are anxious and worried as well as those facing new challenging circumstances.

Also, give thanks for those who are recovering and who have found God's peace.

Our Benefice Service next Sunday, 29th June: The two sister churches in Knighton, St Mary Magdalen and St Guthlac, form one 'benefice' - an ancient term that reflects the bonds of history and shared experience between churches, as well as their shared clergy! Each has a building for worship, a church hall, a PCC and a distinctive character, but the two are joined by something like a family relationship and share many interests, concerns and even people! We alternate Communion services on Sundays, and offer a range of other types of worship, so that everyone can find something comfortable week by week.

When there are five Sundays in a month, then the two churches take it in turn to play host to a joint Eucharistic service for everyone - the distance between them being only 1.3 miles. This month it is the turn of St Guthlac's ... so do please join us at 10.30am on 29th, on Holbrook Road, for this special opportunity to worship together and to demonstrate the friendship and unity that flows from our shared faith and history, and that Jesus prayed for - "Holy Father ...that they may be one as we are one." The Season of 'Trinity' – After the drama and significance of Lent, Easter, and Pentecost, the Church's year now moves on to the quieter months of the season we call 'Trinity', or sometimes 'Ordinary Time'. It is the longest part of the liturgical calendar - this year there are 19 Sundays in Trinity, leading right up to All Saints Day at the start of November, and even later if you include the 'Sundays before Advent'!



This Trinity season is the time when we reflect on our life as the people of God, and how we are shaped by the words and actions of Jesus. This year our Gospel readings on Sundays continue the theme of 'Learning with Luke'.

The liturgical colour for Trinity is green, a symbol of growth, and so in many churches you'll see that the altar or Communion table has

a green frontal cloth, and the ordained Minister may wear a green scarf and outer vestment (or 'chasuable'). Adrian
