Reconciliation in a Time of Conflict, Coventry Cathedral, Saturday 18th October

How can we talk about reconciliation in the midst of war? We know the Bible calls us to be reconcilers, but what does the Christian ministry of reconciliation look like in a time of conflict? What are the challenges faced by those in the context of war, and what might we learn about being reconcilers in a society increasingly characterised by cultural division and conflict? How can we pray, act and speak in these turbulent times? Christians in Ukraine and Israel Palestine have approached this question in different ways, which will in turn help shape our understanding and action in our own contexts.

This significant day conference is hosted by the British Trust for Tantur, which supports the work of the Tantur Ecumenical institute, on the border between Jerusalem and Bethlehem. We will be welcoming their Rector, Fr. John Paul SJ, along with guests from Ukraine, to lead us in our reflection.

This conference will run from 10.00 – 3.30pm at Coventry Cathedral, a community known for its commitment to reconciliation, and as a place to reflect and respond to these difficult questions. Reflections from the Leicestershire Round 100mile Cycle, Amy Barnes







On September 6th I cycled 100 miles around Leicestershire roads to raise funds for LOROs. The route was extremely hilly with a total of 5748 ft elevation, not for the faint hearted. This was a personal challenge, having recently lost a colleague, Helen to breast cancer. Helen had worked for 25 years at Newbold Verdon and Market Bosworth Medical Practice and worked her way up from receptionist to assistant Practice Manager. We said our good byes last week on what would have been her 60th birthday. I had not cycled much before the race and bought a new bike in July, starting build up to 40-50 miles cycles at the weekend to train for this epic challenge with my friend, Emma who has a lot more cycling experience.

Throughout the cycle I was struck by a few thoughts which I'd like to share with you.

- Leicestershire is far hillier than I thought and we are blessed with some stunningly beautiful
 countryside.
- Sometimes when things get tough, you just have to keep peddling.
- Your body can do amazing things if your mind lets it.
- Having support from Emma, my husband, Dan who provided Dad duties while I was out for hours on training cycles, and colleagues was essential to success. The event was incredibly well organised with brilliant support from volunteers.
- There were fewer than ten ladies taking part, a big minority compared with the men. I would like to encourage and inspire other ladies to take up cycling too.
- My work place is a really wonderful community to be part of, I received many, many
 messages of support and encouragement on the day which boosted my morale and helped
 give me to strength to get through the tough bits. The weather was also very kind, perfect
 conditions.
- There is no better feeling than freewheeling down a steep hill for letting go of any burdens and feeling like a child again!
- Helen's husband, lain came to the mid-way point and end to watch the finish. We sat on a bank at Café Ventoux, watching a red kite swooping and circling several times. It was as though Helen was there, watching over us.

LOROS hospice is in danger of closure and the cost of a bed per night is £560. Helen spent her last days there, surrounded by her husband and two sons. If you do feel able to support this cause, it would help this vital work to continue.
