

EcoTip for OCTOBER - Taste the difference!

Local and seasonal food not only tastes great but is better for the planet too. Think about incorporating locally grown produce into your diet and shopping list throughout the seasons, as it is harvested at its peak ripeness ensuring superior flavour, compared to imported alternatives that have travelled thousands of miles. If saying grace before a meal is a regular practice in your household, include giving thanks for your local food producers this month.

Malawi Mobile Clinics: On 21 September, Bishop Christopher presided at our Eucharist service. During the service and in a presentation afterwards, he explained the situation in Northern Malawi and the ongoing work of the clinics. Whilst here he was given a cheque for the clinic and also mentioned that over the years St Guthlac's had raised in the order of £18 000, since the relationship started over 10 years ago.

He said, "Thank you St Guthlac's for the £500 for the clinic. This is a remarkable amount on top of all you have done over the years. I can't thank you enough. You work tirelessly and produce phenomenal results and give such impetus and drive to the team in Malawi. Thank you and thank you on behalf of all those we serve in the villages."

Welcome to our new Archbishop! A week last Friday we received the welcome news that our new Archbishop of Canterbury is to be the current Bishop of London, Dame Sarah Mullaly.



Bishop Sarah has had a Christian faith since the age of 16, nurtured in her local church in Woking, where she grew up and went to school. She entered nursing and rose to become Chief Nursing Officer for England and the National Health Service's Director of Patient Experience for England, from

1999 to 2004, the youngest person to hold these posts.

In the <u>2005 New Year Honours</u>, she was appointed <u>Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire</u> for her services to nursing.

Ordained in 2001, (by Bishop Tom Butler – formerly of this diocese) she became <u>Bishop of Crediton</u> in 2015 and then Bishop of London in 2018, the third most senior cleric in the Church of England.

There are still some in the Church of England who, in good conscience, cannot accept the ministry of women as priests or bishops. For many others, however, Bishop Sarah's appointment is a welcome and natural extension of the Church's recognition of the calling and gifts of all women, alongside men, in ministry. Personally, I am very pleased to give her a warm and unreserved welcome as our new Archbishop – her experience and gifts make her well suited to this new vocation, the Crown Nominations Committee has discerned a clear calling, and the Church is now making another important step towards full equality for everyone, within the glorious diversity that God has given us.

In Knighton we have experienced and much appreciated women's ministry and leadership in both lay and ordained roles for a long time now, so you might like to join me and send your very best wishes and the assurance of our prayers to Bishop Sarah.
