Remembrance Sunday

Prayers with poppies - suitable for children too

Anyone can be involved in prayers for remembering, whether in church or at home. All you need for this simple prayer is a poppy each.



First, look at your poppy.

Poppies are bright and cheerful flowers: give thanks to God for the lives of those who have died in war, remembering all the joy they brought to families and friends, and all the good things they did for their home and their country.

Then look at the red petals: red reminds us of danger and harm. Ask God to be close to those who are still facing danger each day, to give courage to the armed forces, and compassion to all who help others.

Now place your whole hand over the poppy: poppies are also fragile and need to be handled gently. God cares for those who are hurting and those who are sad. Ask God to comfort all who are grieving the loss of someone they love.

Finally place a finger on the centre of the poppy: ask God to help you play your part in working for peace in the world.

Welcome to our new Archbishop! We welcome the news that our new Archbishop of Canterbury is to be the current Bishop of London, Dame Sarah Mullaly.



Bishop Sarah has had a Christian faith since the age of 16, nurtured in her local church in Woking, where she grew up and went to school. She entered nursing and rose to become Chief Nursing Officer for England and the National Health Service's Director of Patient Experience for England, from 1999 to 2004, the youngest person to hold these posts.

In the <u>2005 New Year Honours</u>, she was appointed <u>Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire</u> for her services to nursing.

Ordained in 2001, (by Bishop Tom Butler – formerly of this diocese) she became <u>Bishop of Crediton</u> in 2015 and then Bishop of London in 2018, the third most senior cleric in the Church of England.

There are still some in the Church of England who, in good conscience, cannot accept the ministry of women as priests or bishops. For many others, however, Bishop Sarah's appointment is a welcome and natural extension of the Church's recognition of the calling and gifts of all women, alongside men, in ministry. Personally, I am very pleased to give her a warm and unreserved welcome as our new Archbishop – her experience and gifts make her well suited to this new vocation, the Crown Nominations Committee has discerned a clear calling, and the Church is now making another important step towards full equality for everyone, within the glorious diversity that God has given us.

In Knighton we have experienced and much appreciated women's ministry and leadership in both lay and ordained roles for a long time now, so you might like to join me and send your very best wishes and the assurance of our prayers to Bishop Sarah. Eco Tip for November: Measure your carbon footprint. Take an audit of your individual or household carbon footprint and repeat each year to see if you can reduce it! 
